

Abuse and Neglect

Provincial - Abuse and Neglect

Children and Youth: If you think a child or youth under 19 years of age is being abused or neglected, you have the legal duty to report your concern to a child welfare worker. Your call will be answered by the Provincial Centralized Screening team (PCS) and their primary role is to receive and assess child protection reports and initial requests for ministry service across the province, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Adults with Developmental or Intellectual Disabilities: Community Living British Columbia (CLBC) is a designated agency with specific responsibilities under the Adult Guardianship Act related to responding to allegations of abuse and neglect involving adults eligible for CLBC Services.

Please Note: If you are unsure about this process, speak with your manager.

Adults: Island Health <u>Community Health Services (CHS)</u> responds to reports of abuse or neglect of adults. Island Health is an agency designated under AGA Part 3 Support and Assistance for Abused and Neglected Adults to receive and respond to reports of adult abuse, neglect or self-neglect. This applies whether the adult is abused, neglected or self-neglecting in a public place, in the adult's home, a relative's home, a care facility, or any other place except a correctional centre. Any person may make a report to Island Health.

BC Housing offers a range of housing support programs, as well as affordable and subsidized housing for senior renters with low to moderate incomes.

BC Housing manages public housing in BC, and maintains the housing registry, a subsidized housing listing and application service. The housing registry includes public housing and some non-profit and co-op housing.

First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) is the health and wellness partner to over 200 diverse First Nations communities and citizens across BC.

The Health Benefits Program covers six benefit areas:

- 1. Dental
- 2. Medical Supplies and Equipment
- 3. Medical Transportation
- 4. Mental Health
- 5. Pharmacy
- 6. Vision

The program also manages the BC Medical Services Plan (MSP) and pays for ambulance bills for eligible First Nations in BC. Health Benefits provides benefit coverage through partnerships with Pacific Blue Cross (PBC), BC PharmaCare, Indigenous Services Canada (ISC), and First Nations organizations.

BC First Nations Health Handbook developed by First Nations peoples for First Nations peoples.

Medical Services Plan (MSP): free provincial medical coverage for citizens of BC.

Did you know? People who have moved from another province often have to reapply for MSP. Newcomers, have been invited here – and we have a duty to ensure they have BC medical and interventions for their medical needs, as well as social supports for food security and housing.

Fair Pharmacare assists to pay for some medications, medical devices, supplies, such as prostheses, and diabetes supplies. It is income-based, the less a person earns the more help they will receive.

Did you know? If a person has not filed their income taxes, they will be charged full price for their medications.

Person with Multiple Barriers

The **Person with Multiple Barriers (PPMB)** application can be completed for a client if income assistance is in place.

This service is available for people who experience barriers to employment.

Who can help with this application? *RSWs, RNs, Registered Clinical Counselor (RCC), Occupational Therapists (OT), Physiotherapist (PT), Chiropractors, Psychologists and providers have the ability to complete this application on behalf of the client.*

Barriers to employment include:

- Currently experiencing homelessness or having experienced homelessness in the past 12 months
- Currently experiencing domestic violence or having experienced domestic violence in the past 6 months
- Less than Grade 12 education
- Needing English language skills training
- Not having basic skills for employment
- Having a Criminal Record
- Having accessed emergency health, mental health or addiction services multiple times within the past 12 months
- Recent Convention refugee (within the past 24 months) or currently a refugee claimant or person applying for protection
- Former Child in Care (Ministry of Children and Family Development or similar Canadian jurisdiction)
- Other severe barrier to employment listed on their application

Did you know? Often people meet one of the criteria's for this service, however are unable to get an appointment and/or access the clinic (e.g. transportation costs) – resulting in them living on \$300 less each month.

- 3. **Section 3:** Is the assessor assessment that can be completed RSWs, RNs, OT, PT, Chiropractors, and Psychologists.
- 4. **Section 2 and 3:** both sections 2 and 3 can be completed solely by the provider (Physician, NP and Psychologist) on behalf of the client.

Prescribed Class allows MSDPR to designate someone as a *Person with* **Disabilities (PWD)**, without going through the standard application process, if the person has already been approved for another prescribed government program or benefit. Current regulation prescribes the classes of people who will be able to use this more streamlined process to become designated as a PWD.

Those classes are:

- 1. People enrolled in BC PharmaCare Plan P, Palliative Care Benefits;
- People who have been determined by the Ministry of Children and Family Development to be eligible for the At Home Program – Medical Benefits and Respite (a program which assists family with the costs of caring for a severely disabled child);
- People who have been determined by Community Living British Columbia to be eligible to receive its support and services (Developmental Disability or Personal Supports Initiative); and
- 4. People determined as <u>disabled</u> by the Government of Canada and eligible for the Canada Pension Plan Disability Benefit or the Canada Pension Plan Post-Retirement Disability Benefit.

Additional Eligibilities for Clients on Income Assistance, PPMB and PWD

A **Monthly Nutritional Supplement (MNS)** is only available to a recipient eligible for the *Persons with Disabilities designation* who is receiving *disability assistance* and if the ministry is satisfied that the following conditions are met based on written confirmation by the recipient's *medical practitioner*, *nurse practitioner* or *registered dietitian*:

- the person has a severe medical condition causing a chronic, progressive deterioration of health
- 2. as a result of this deterioration of health, the person displays two or more of the following symptoms:
 - malnutrition
 - underweight status
 - significant weight loss
 - o significant muscle mass loss
 - o significant neurological degeneration
 - o significant deterioration of a vital organ
 - moderate to severe immune suppression
- 3. to alleviate these symptoms, the person requires one or both of the following items:
 - additional nutritional items that are part of a caloric supplementation to a regular dietary intake
 - o vitamins and minerals
- 4. failure to obtain these items will result in imminent danger to the person's life

Medical or Surgical Supplies may be provided to eligible clients when the ministry is satisfied that **all** of the following requirements are met:

- the supplies are prescribed by a *medical practitioner* or *nurse* practitioner and **only** the following can be considered:
